SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Read these instructions completely before beginning installation. Failure to follow them could cause a heater malfunction resulting in serious injury and/or property damage.

WARNING: All electric heaters have hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. Do not use it in areas where gasoline, paint or flammable liquids are or are stored.

This fireplace meets the construction and safety standards of H.U.D. for application in manufactured homes when installed according to these instructions

- When using electrical heaters, basic precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons, including the following:.
- Failure to follow these instructions may also void your fire insurance and/or warranty.

- **WARNING: Improper installation, adjustment, alteration, service or maintenance can cause injury or property damage. Refer to this manual. For assistance or additional information, consult a qualified installer.**
- **CAUTION: Do not expose the heater to the elements (such as rain, etc).**
- **Do not place clothing or other flammable material on or near firebox. Never place any objects on the fireplace.**
- **Do not place clothing or other flammable material on or near firebox. Never place any objects on the fireplace.**
- **Fireplace becomes very hot when running. Keep children and adults away from hot surfaces to avoid burns or clothing ignition. Fireplace will remain hot for a time after shutdown. Allow surfaces to cool before touching.**



CAUTION: In order to avoid overheating, do not cover the heater.

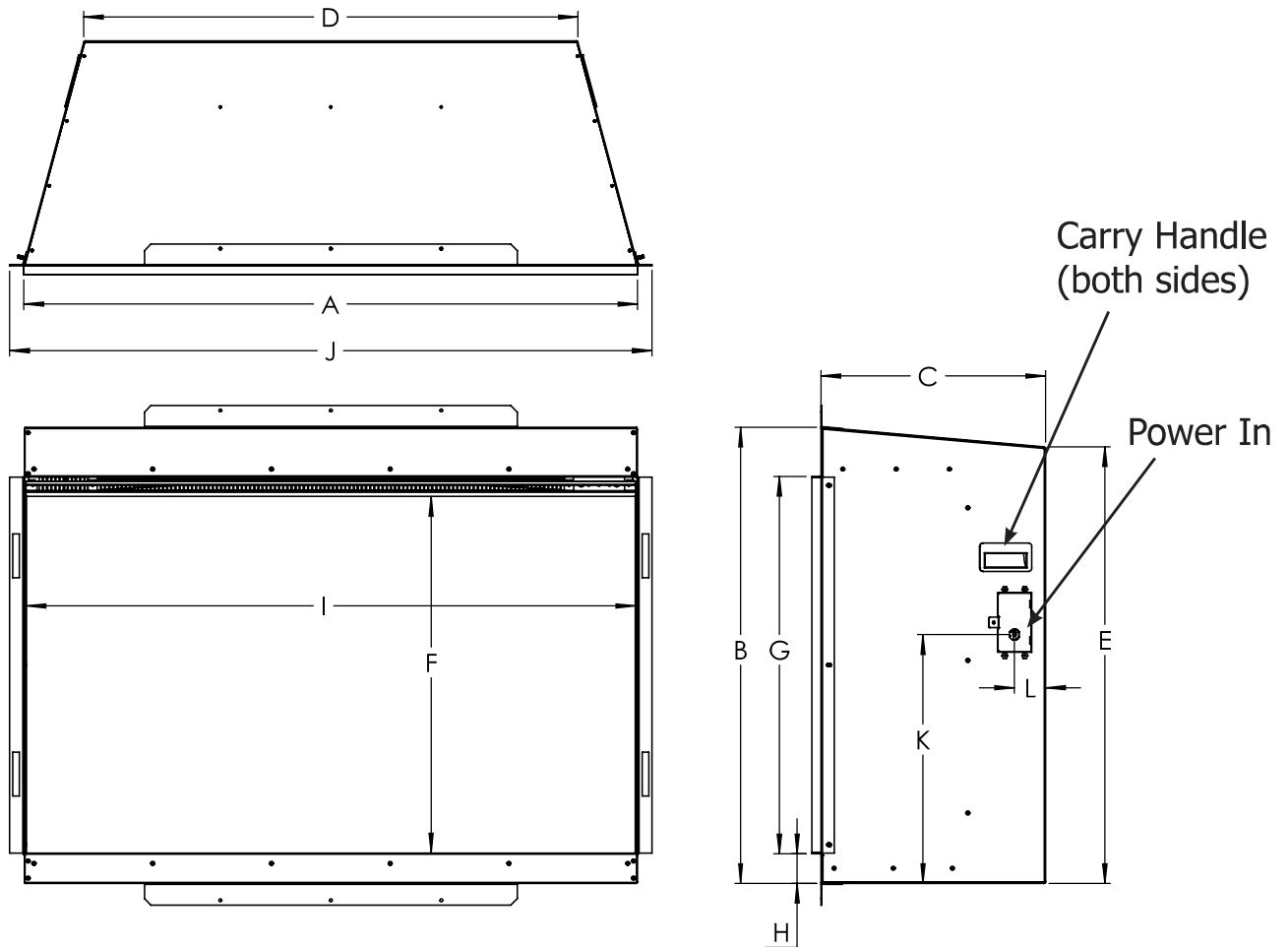
1. Read all instructions before installing or using this heater.
2. This heater is hot when in use. To avoid burns, do not let bare skin touch hot surfaces. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes, and curtains at least 3 feet (0.9m) from the front of the heater and keep them away from the sides and rear.
3. Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used by or near children or disabled people and whenever the heater is left operating and unattended.
4. Do not operate any heater after it malfunctions, has been dropped, or damaged in any manner. Disconnect power at service panel and have heater inspected by an authorized technician or a reputable electrician before using.
5. Do not use outdoors.
6. To disconnect heater, turn controls to off and turn off power to heater circuit at main disconnect panel.
7. Do not insert or allow foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening as this may cause an electric shock or fire, or damage the heater.
8. To prevent a possible fire, do not block air intakes or exhaust in any manner.
9. A heater has hot and arcing or sparking parts inside. Do not use it in areas where gasoline, paint or flammable vapours or liquids are used or stored.
10. Use this heater only as described in this manual. Any other use not recommended by the manufacturer may cause fire, electric shock or injury to persons.

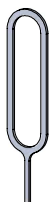

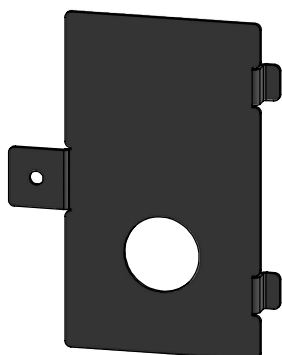

INITIAL INSTALLATION

WARNING: If the information in these instructions is not followed exactly, a fire or explosion may result causing property damage, personal injury or death

WARNING: RISK OF FIRE!

To prevent a possible fire, do not block air intake or exhaust in any manner. Do not use on soft surfaces where openings may become blocked. Do not blow or place insulation against the firebox.

To reduce the risk of fire do not store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors in the vicinity of this or any other heater.

CAUTION: Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes and curtains at least 3 feet (0.9m) from the front of the heater and keep them away from the sides and rear.

CAUTION: Wear gloves and safety glasses for protection during installation and maintenance.

Installing the fireplace

Select a suitable location that is not susceptible to moisture and is a safe distance from drapes, furniture and high traffic areas.

INSTALLATION

ELECTRICAL REQUIREMENTS:

For installations using the standard 1500W heater, a dedicated 20 AMP 120VAC circuit will be required. For installations opting to use the 3000W heater, a dedicated 20 Amp 4 wire 240VAC circuit will be required instead. No modification to the fireplace or extra parts are needed to use the 3000W heater.

Note - Follow all national and local electrical and building codes.

All UE35 and UE42 fireplace models come supplied with a grounded 3-prong power cord attached for 120VAC, 1500W installations.

WIRING:

To be performed by a qualified electrician according to local building codes.

The fireplace comes pre wired with a 3 prong power cord for installations using the standard 1500W heater utilizing an existing accessible electrical outlet i.e. fireplace insert. For installations where the fireplace will be built into the wall, the power cord must first be removed.

- Locate and remove the electrical cover plate on the right hand side of the fireplace (when facing the fireplace).
- Remove the clear plastic cover above the wiring terminals.
- Disconnect the three wires from the terminal block and discard the power cord and cover plate.
- Locate the hard wire cover plate supplied in the manual bag of the fireplace and wire the incoming hard wire as instructed on the following page.

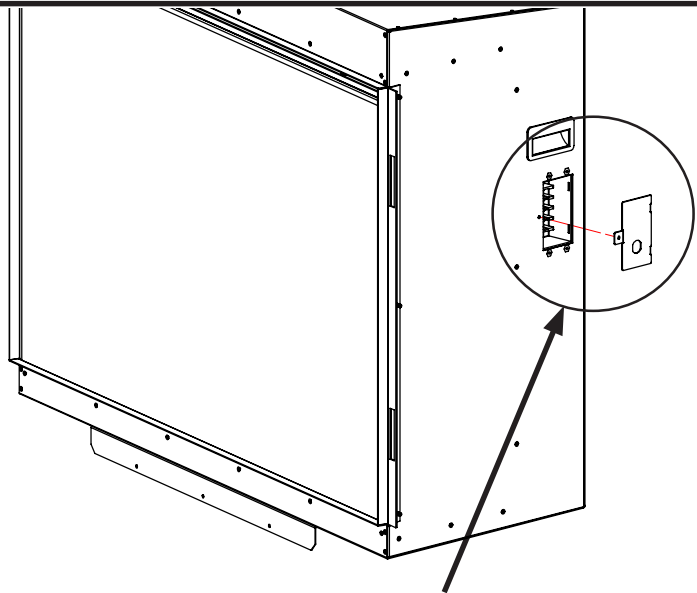


Figure 1: Electrical Cover Location

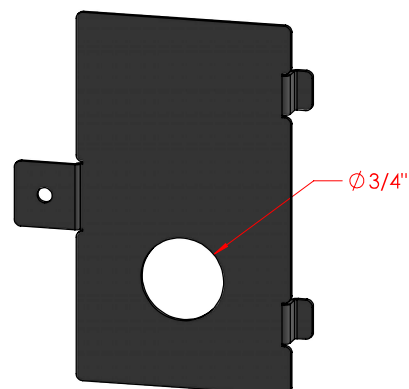


Figure 3: Supplied hard wire cover plate

INSTALLATION

Make sure the connections are made using a wiring connector type approved by local building codes.

120VAC 1500W Wiring

For installations using the standard 1500W heater, A 3 wire 120VAC 20 Amp dedicated circuit will be required. See the 3 wire diagram as shown. Connect to the L1, Ground and Neutral terminals. **L2 terminal is not used for 120VAC installations.**

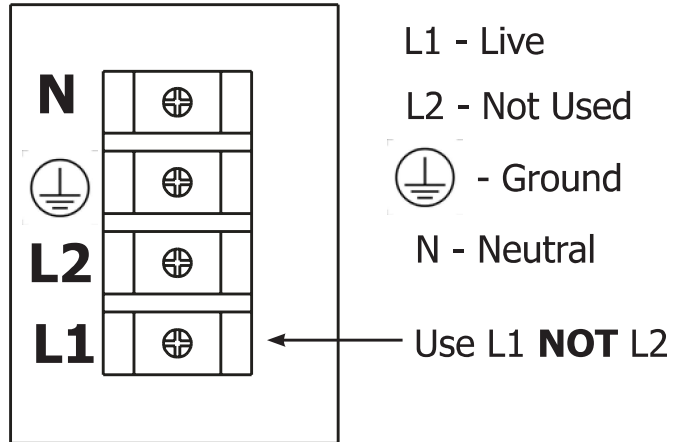


Figure 4: 1500W Wiring Diagram

240VAC 3000W Wiring

For installations opting to use the 3000W heater, a 4 wire 240VAC 20 Amp dedicated circuit **MUST** be used. See the 4 wire diagram as shown. All 4 wiring terminals are used for this installation. The fireplace must be hard wired and **the supplied power cord CANNOT be used.**

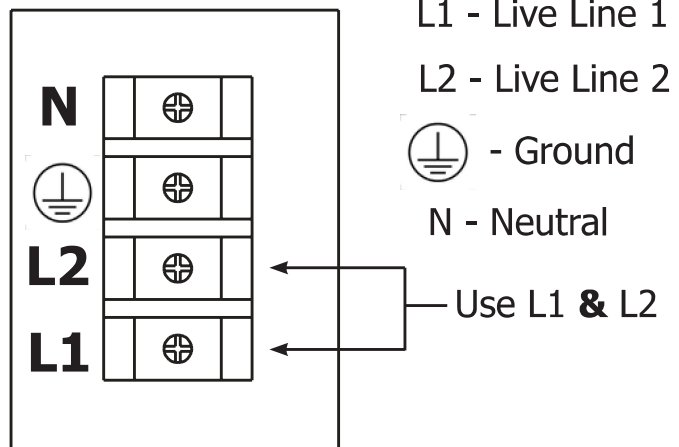


Figure 5: 3000W Wiring Diagram

MINIMUM FIREPLACE SIZE

This electric fireplace is permitted to be installed as an insert into a pre-existing masonry or factory built fireplace. See the table below for the minimum fireplace size required. A surround panel will be required to complete the installation.

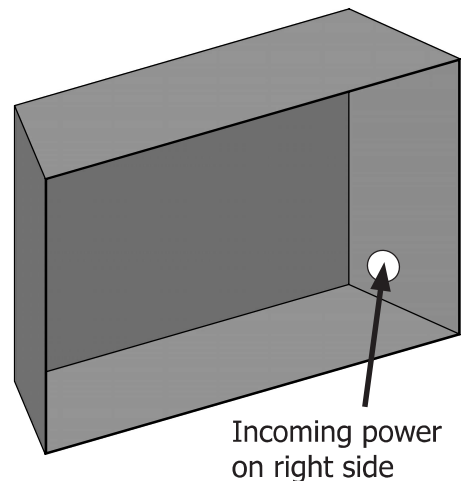


Figure 6: Incoming Power Location

INSTALLATION

BUILT-IN / ZERO CLEARANCE

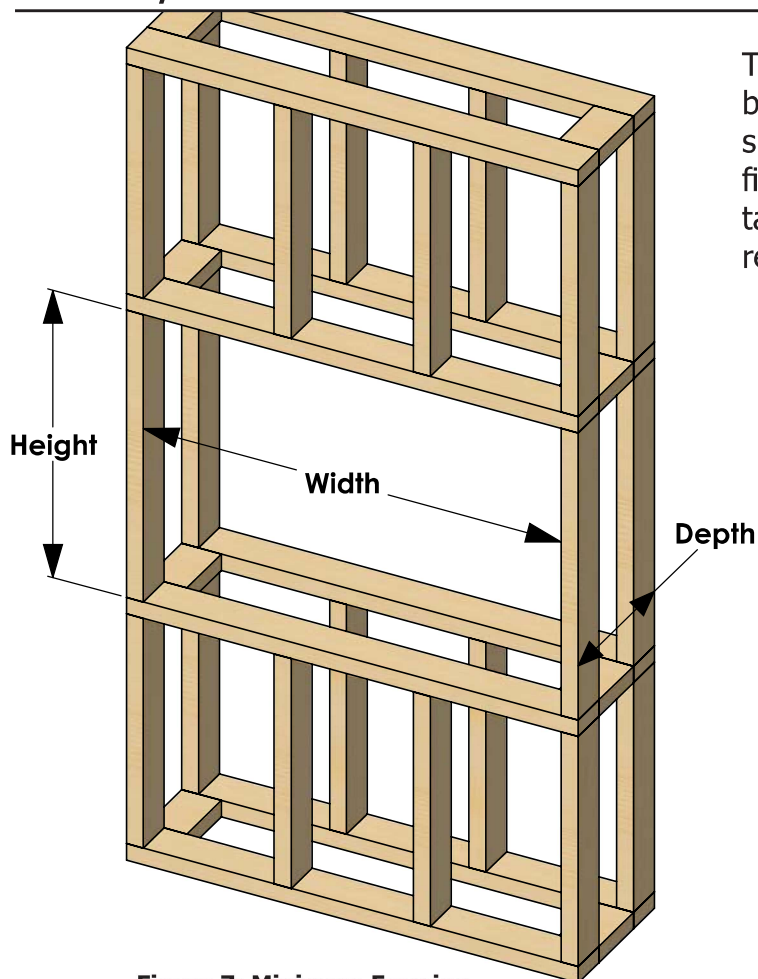


Figure 7: Minimum Framing

This electric fireplace may also be permanently built into the wall as a zero clearance fireplace. The supplied power cord must first be removed from the fireplace as outlined on the previous page. See the table below for the minimum framing dimensions required.

A surround panel is not required to finish a built-in installation but one may still be used, if desired, when correctly planned for. **Only 1/2" (12.7mm) thick finishing material can be used and it must stop 3/4" (19mm) short of the side finishing flanges** to leave the surround panel slots accessible. If a surround panel is not desired there is no material thickness limitation and it can finish directly against the side finishing flanges on the fireplace.

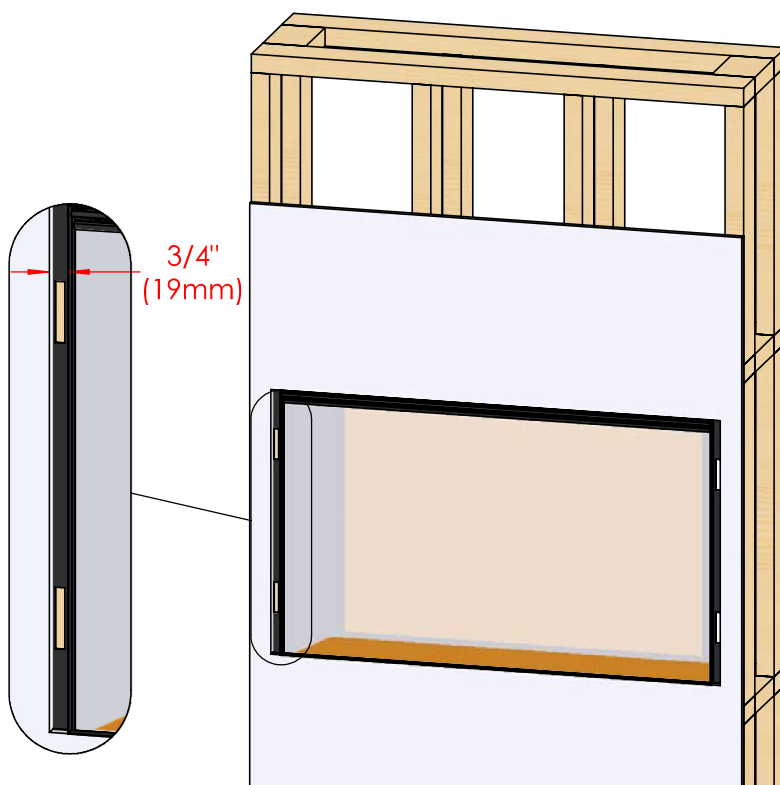


Figure 8: Built-in Finishing

INSTALLATION

MINIMUM FLOOR HEIGHT

When preparing for installation the desired surround panel must be accounted for. See the table below for the minimum height the fireplace needs to be off the floor depending on the surround panel size and configuration used. Measurement taken from the bottom of the fireplace.

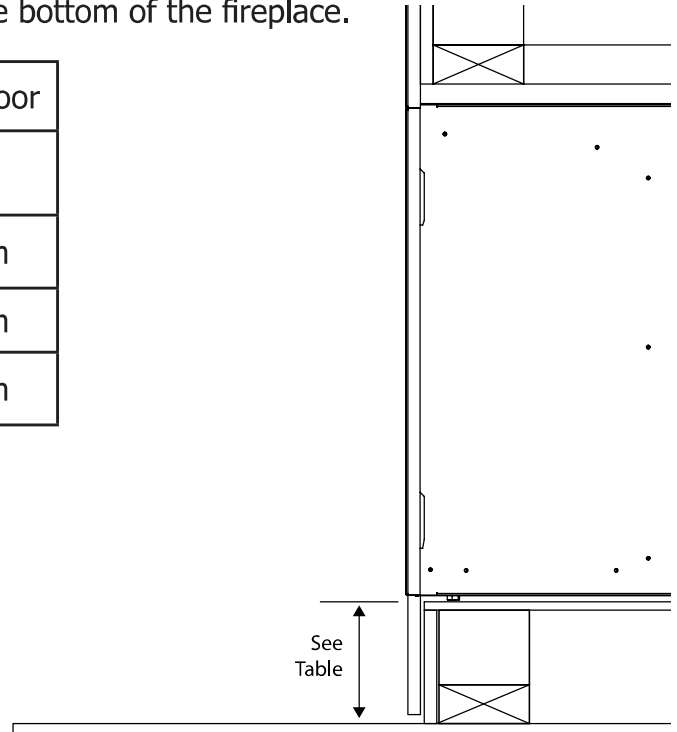


Figure 9: Required Floor Clearance

CLEARANCE TO COMBUSTIBLES

If installing a mantel above the fireplace there must be a minimum 8" clearance as measured from the top of the fireplace opening. Heat resistant paint is recommended to prevent any potential discolouration. Non-combustible front wall finishing material is not required.

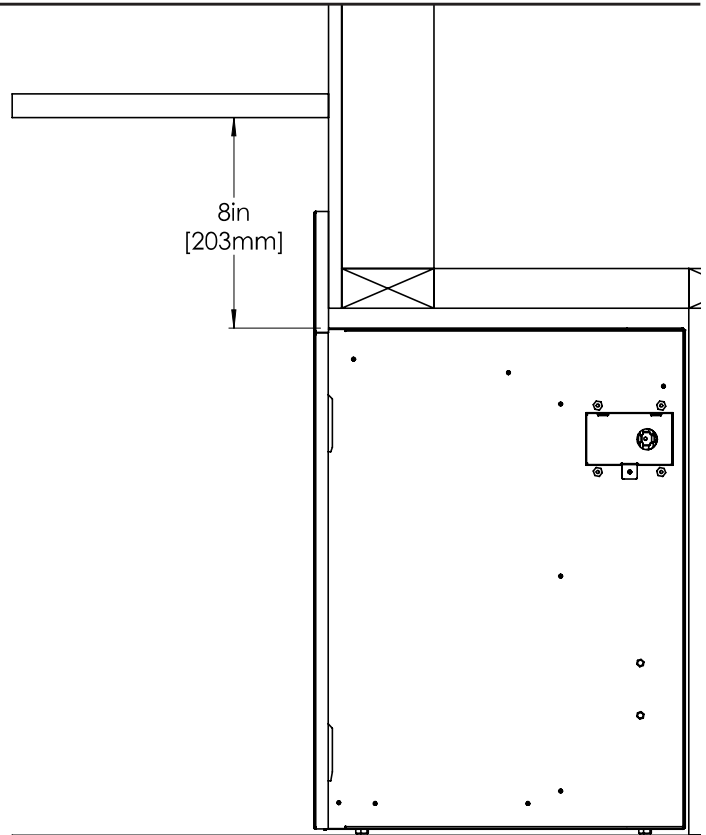


Figure 10: Mantle Clearance

INSTALLATION

FRONT GLASS

This fireplace has a bottom channel and a 2 piece top retainer that holds the front glass in place. There are four small Phillips screws across the top of the fireplace that hold the retainer in place.

Prior to front glass installation, remove the protective plastic film from the rear flame screen.

1. Remove the plastic corners and inner protective film from the front glass. Insert the front glass into the bottom channel at an angle.
2. Gently lay the front glass back until the top touches the fireplace.
3. First, install the top retainer using the four (4) supplied screws and Phillips screw-driver.
4. Second, attach the louver to the top retainer using the four (4) remaining Phillips screws. The outer protective film can now be removed from the front glass.

To remove the front glass after installation, reverse these steps.

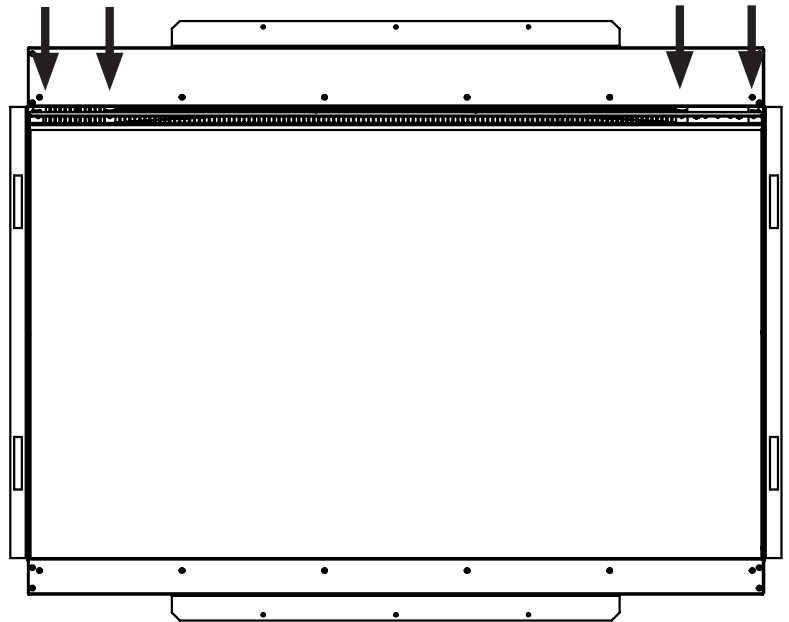


Figure 11: Front Glass Retainer Screw Positions

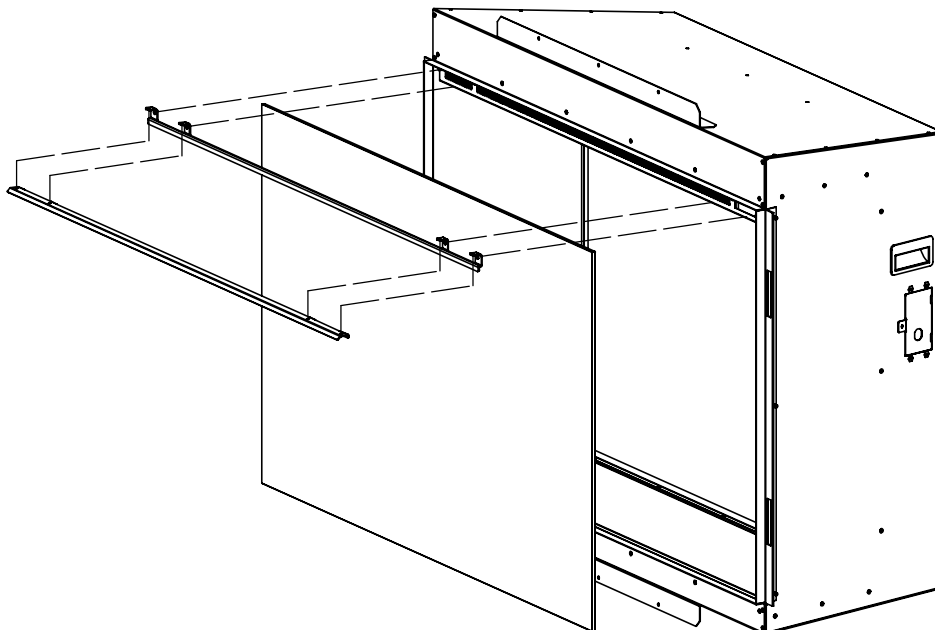


Figure 12: Front Glass Removal / Installation

INSTALLATION

SURROUND PANEL

If installing the fireplace as an insert, a surround panel will be required to complete the installation.

The surround panels are a 4 piece design and will require assembly prior to installation as shown:

Lay all 4 panels face down on a soft surface or blanket. Use a 1/4" hex / socket driver to install the supplied sheet metal screws into the panels to attach them together.

If using the surround panel on a built-in fireplace, an additional filler strip (supplied with the panel) will need to be fastened to the top panel. Refer to the instruction sheet supplied with the surround panel for more information.

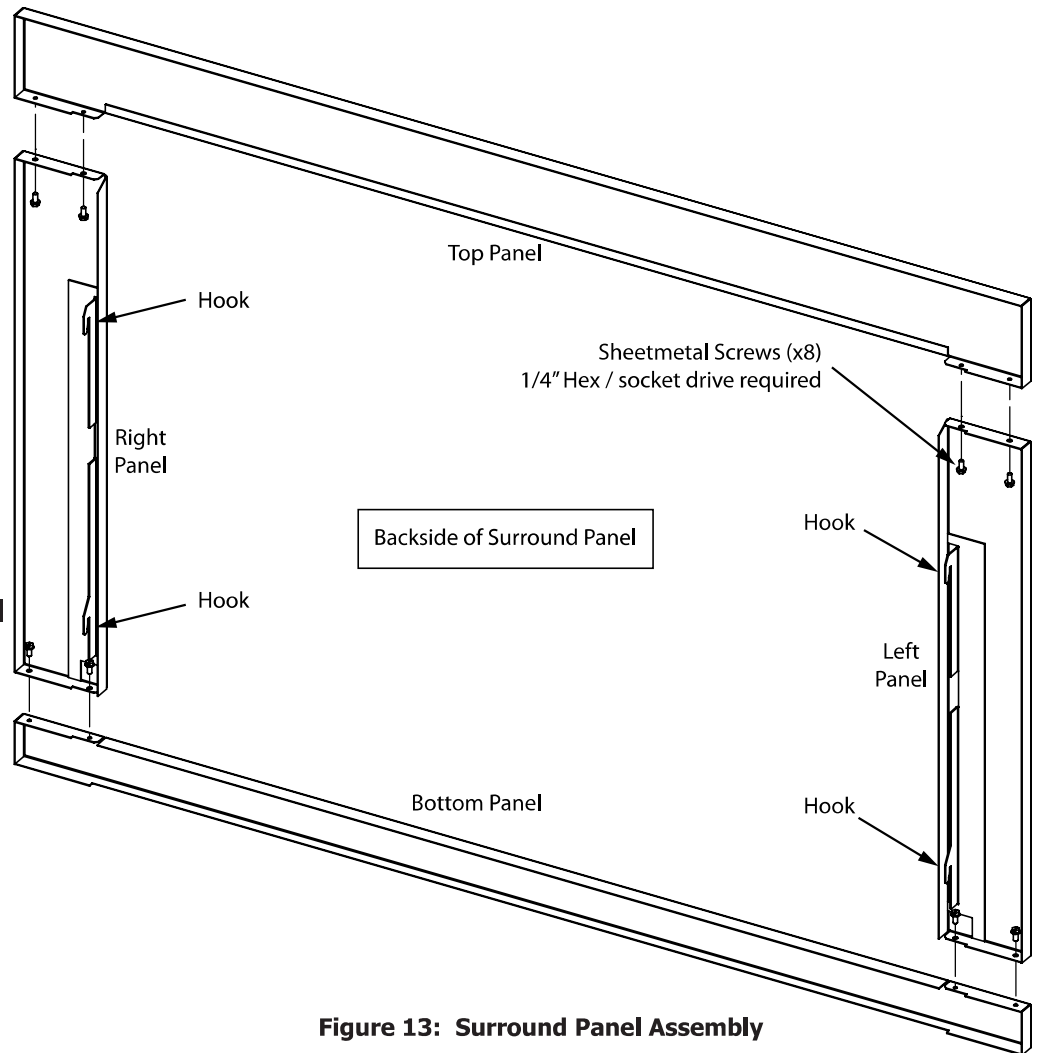


Figure 13: Surround Panel Assembly

Once the surround panel is assembled it easily hooks onto the two slots on each side at the front of the fireplace.

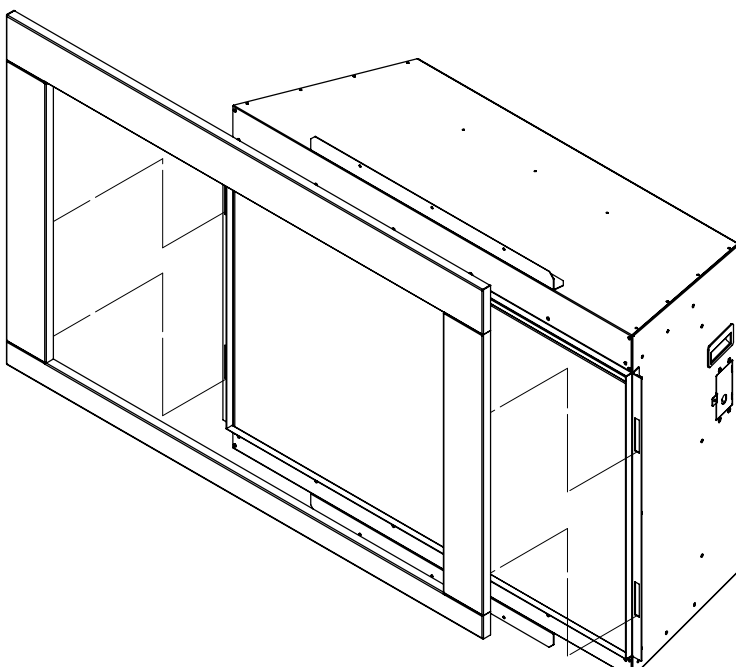


Figure 14: Surround Panel Installation

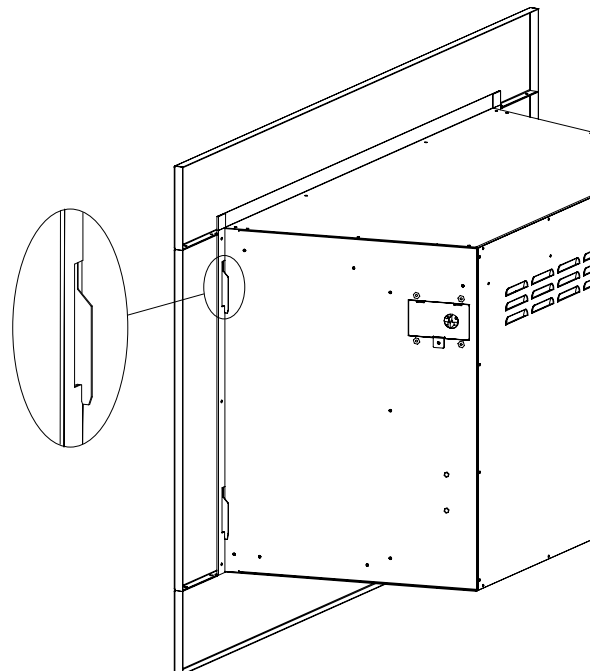


Figure 15: Surround Panel Hooks Installed

OPERATION

MANUAL CONTROLS

For manual control of the fireplace there is a control panel located just above the front glass at the top right hand side behind the glass retainer louver. The control panel consists of 3 black buttons which are Power, Heat and Colour from left to right. To the right of the Colour button is the Reset button.

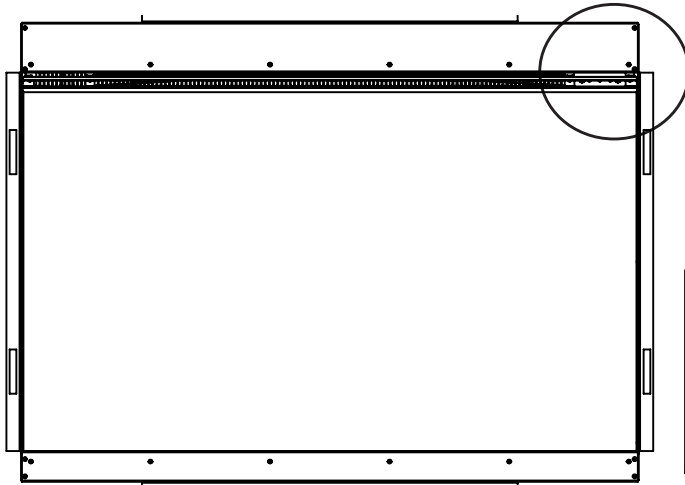


Figure 16: Control Panel Location

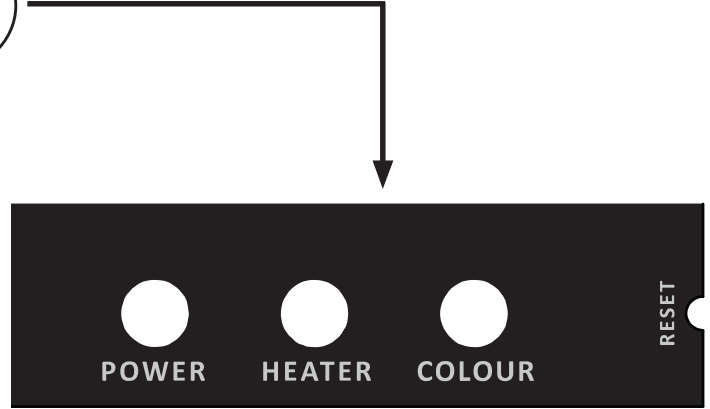


Figure 17: Control Panel

Power - Press once to wake up the fireplace and press again to turn the fireplace on. To turn the fireplace off press button again at any time.

Heater - Press once to turn the fireplace heater on low. Press twice to turn the heater up to high. Press button again to turn heater off.

Colour - Pressing the colour button will cycle the fireplace through 7 preset coloured fireplace schemes.

Reset - Clears the fireplace memory of any paired remote. Insert the reset key or an unfolded paperclip into the pin hole and hold for 3 seconds until a "beep" is heard. The fireplace is now ready to pair to a new remote. See Remote Controls section of manual for pairing instructions.

Indicator Lights: Hidden behind the rear flame panel of the fireplace, in the upper right corner, are a set of indicator lights that illuminate momentarily when the fireplace is turned on to identify the status of fireplace:


The fireplace is turned on. The heater is currently turned off.

The fireplace is turned on. The heater is currently turned on low.

The fireplace is turned on. The heater is currently turned on high.

<i>Continuous Blinking</i>
Fireplace is disconnected from Wi-Fi, check wireless network status. See Wi-Fi Controls section of manual for more information.

OPERATION

REMOTE CONTROLS

The fireplace may also be controlled using the supplied remote. The remote control is capable of making many fireplace setting adjustments that are not possible with the manual controls. To use the remote first install the supplied battery (see Remote Control Battery section). Once the battery is installed the remote must be paired to the fireplace.

Pairing the Remote to the fireplace:

1. Manually turn the fireplace on by pressing the POWER button on the control panel
2. Press the power button again and hold it down for 3 seconds until three "beeps" are heard. The first orange indicator light should now be flashing.
3. Within 5 seconds, repeatedly press the power button on the remote until a "beep" is heard and the orange indicator light has stopped flashing. Pairing must be done within 5 seconds of hearing the two "beeps" or else the fireplace will exit pairing mode.

Remote Control Layout

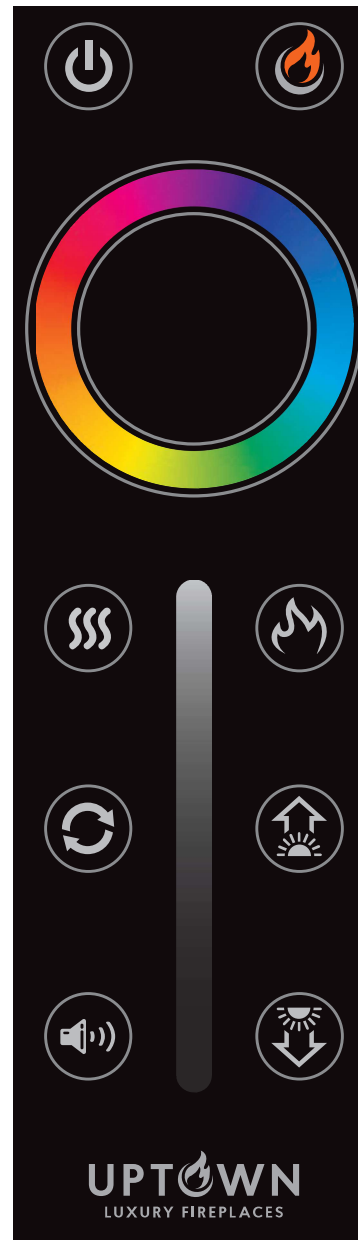
POWER - Turns fireplace on and off. When turned on the fireplace will return to its last used settings when it was turned off.

BRIGHTNESS SLIDER - Slide your finger/thumb up and down the white bar in between the buttons below the colour wheel to control brightness of the selected zone.

HEATER - Cycles the fireplace heater between low, high and off. Set as desired.

FADE - All zones of the fireplace will cycle through various demo modes - 7 & 3 colour gradient/fade, 7 & 3 colour jump, red/green/blue gradient.

SPEAKER - Pressing this button turns the built in crackling wood fire sound effect on and off.



RESET - Returns fireplace to signature Uptown Fireplace colour scheme.

COLOUR WHEEL - Slide your finger/thumb around the colour wheel to set the desired colour of the selected fireplace zone.

FLAME - This is a zone setting. Touching this button will allow you to change the colour and brightness of the flame by using the colour wheel and brightness slider.

EMBER BED - This is a zone setting that controls the color and brightness of the ember bed.

TOP LIGHT - This is a zone setting that controls the colour and brightness of the top light.

OPERATION

Wi-Fi CONTROLS

This fireplace is also capable of being controlled over Wi-Fi using an Apple or Android mobile device. Scan the QR code for an instructional walk through video on how to download and setup the app needed to control your Uptown Electric fireplace. Alternatively, you can follow the steps below.



1. Download the app **Smart Life - Smart Living**, from either the Apple App Store or Google Play Store, and create a new user account.
2. Turn on the fireplace using either the control panel or remote control.

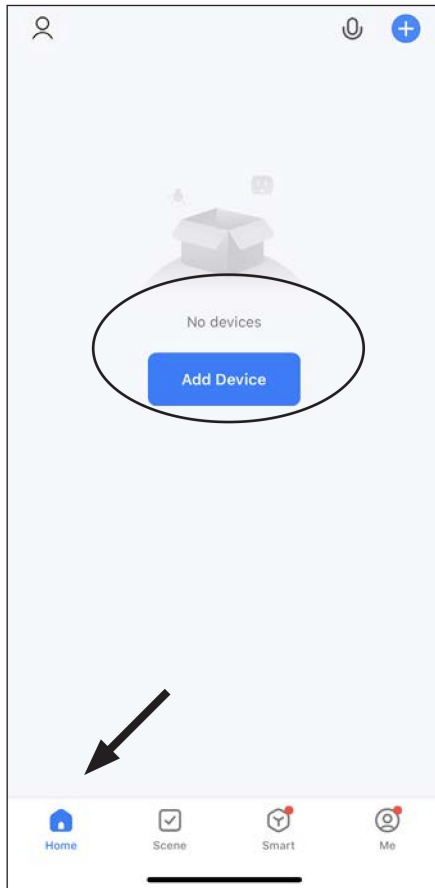


Figure 21: Add Device

3. Navigate to the **Home** screen in the app and press the **Add Device** button.

4. On the Add Device screen select the **Small Home Appliances** category then pick **Electric Fireplace (Wi-Fi)**.

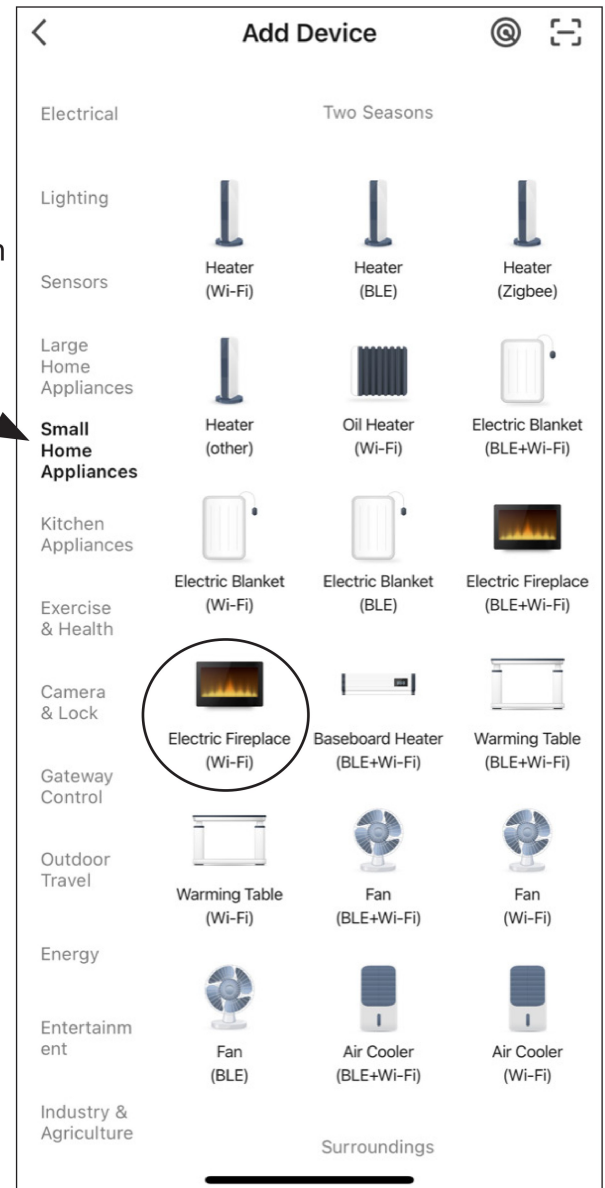


Figure 22: Appliance Selection

OPERATION

5. Next you will be prompted to connect to your existing home wireless network. Select the appropriate 2.4Ghz network and log in.

Note - Only 2.4GHz wireless networks are compatible, 5GHz wireless networks cannot be used. If not available, contact your wireless service provider for further information on setting up a 2.4GHz wireless network.

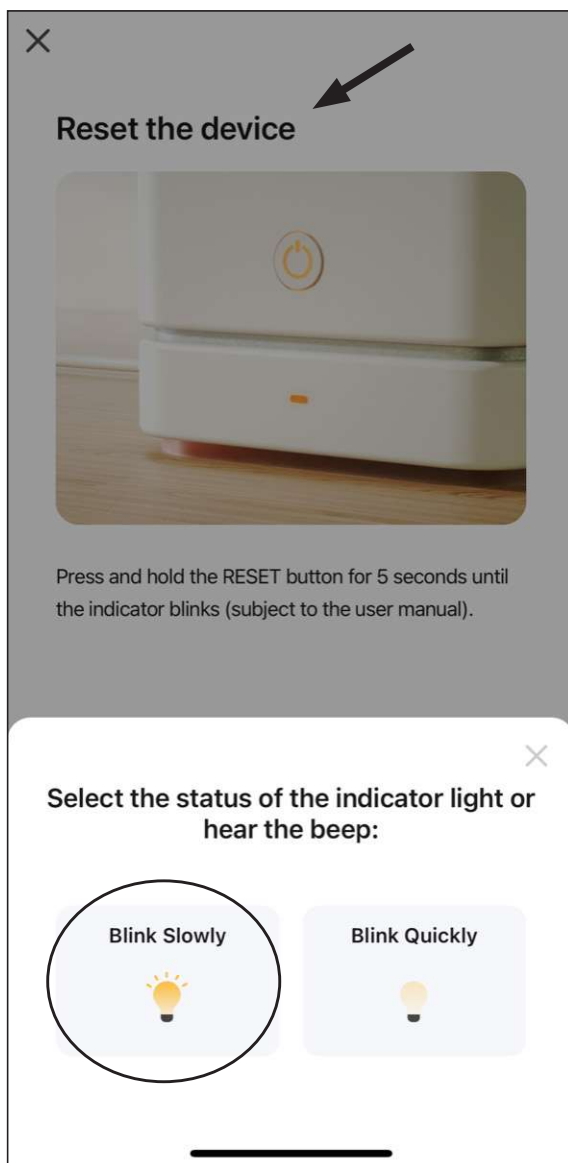


Figure 24: Fireplace Pairing

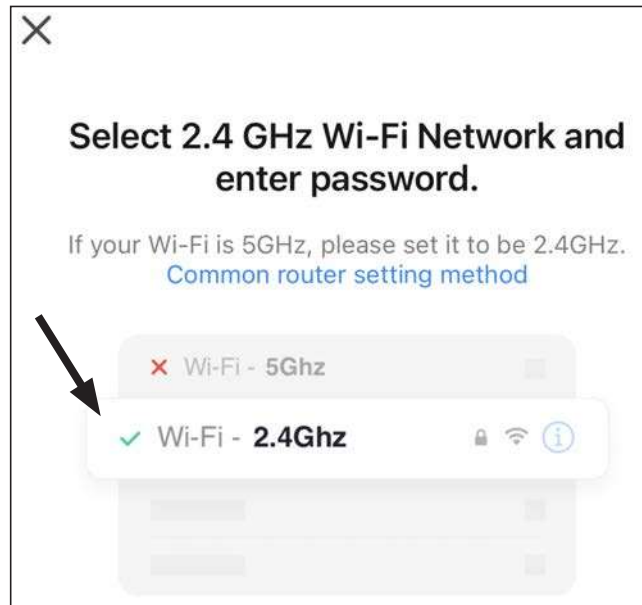


Figure 23: Network Connection

6. Once you are connected to your home network put the fireplace into pairing mode. Press and hold the **COLOUR** button on the control panel (see page 12) of the fireplace until the back flame and ember bed begin slowly flashing at the same time.

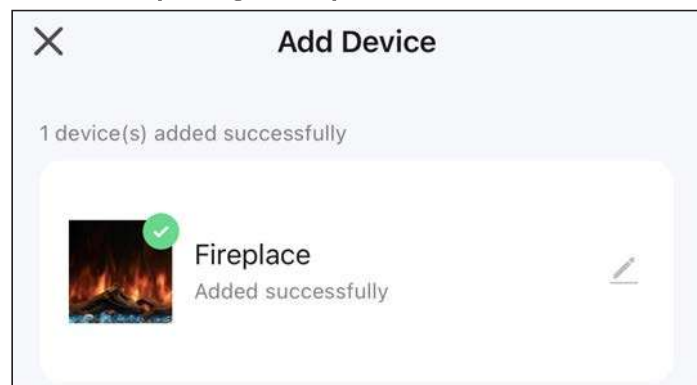


Figure 25: Fireplace Successfully Paired

7. With the fireplace now in pairing mode select the **Blink Slowly** option on the **Reset the Device** screen in the app (see figure 24). The app will begin pairing to the fireplace on a timing screen and automatically finish once pairing is successful (see figure 25).

OPERATION

8. With the fireplace now successfully paired it can be controlled in the same manner as the remote controls (see page 13). Added capabilities like Sleep Timer and Heat Program are only possible when using the app.

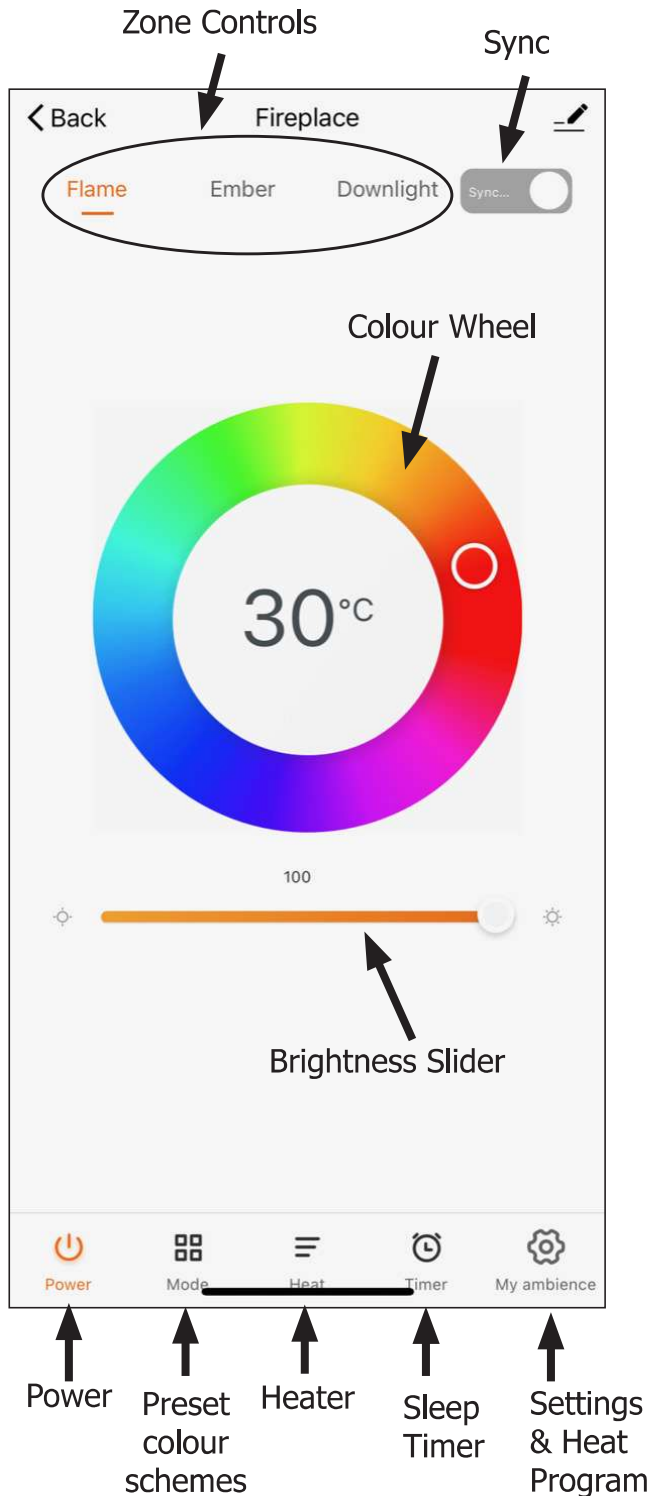


Figure 26: Fireplace App Controls

Creating a Heat Program

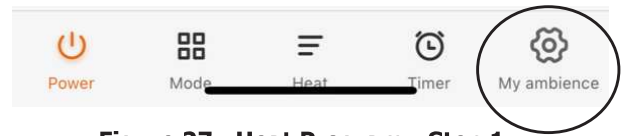


Figure 27: Heat Program - Step 1

In the **My Ambience** screen select the **Heat Program** option. This feature is a 7-day program that allows you to pick what time of day you would like the fireplace and heater to turn on and off.

1. Select the desired day of the week and time slot. In the example below a program has been selected for Wednesdays from 1:00PM-6:00PM.

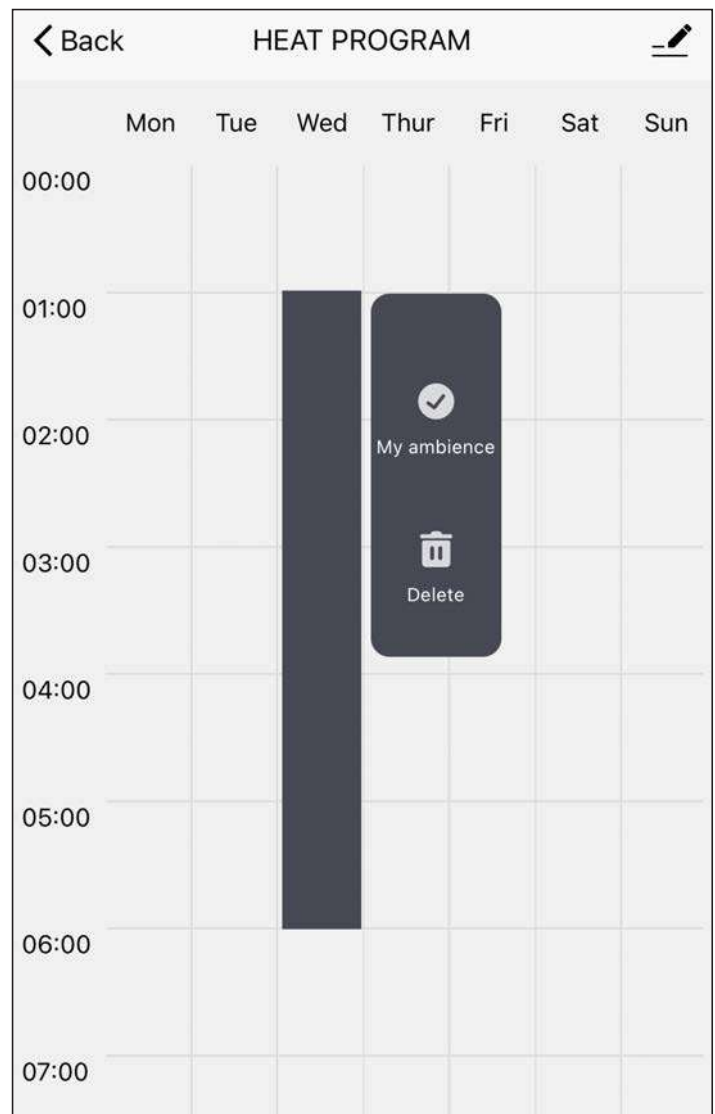


Figure 28: Heat Program - Step 2

OPERATION

2. Next, in the pop-up window select the desired program settings:

Switch - Turn fireplace on or off

Gear - Turn heater on low, high, off

Temperature - Set desired temperature

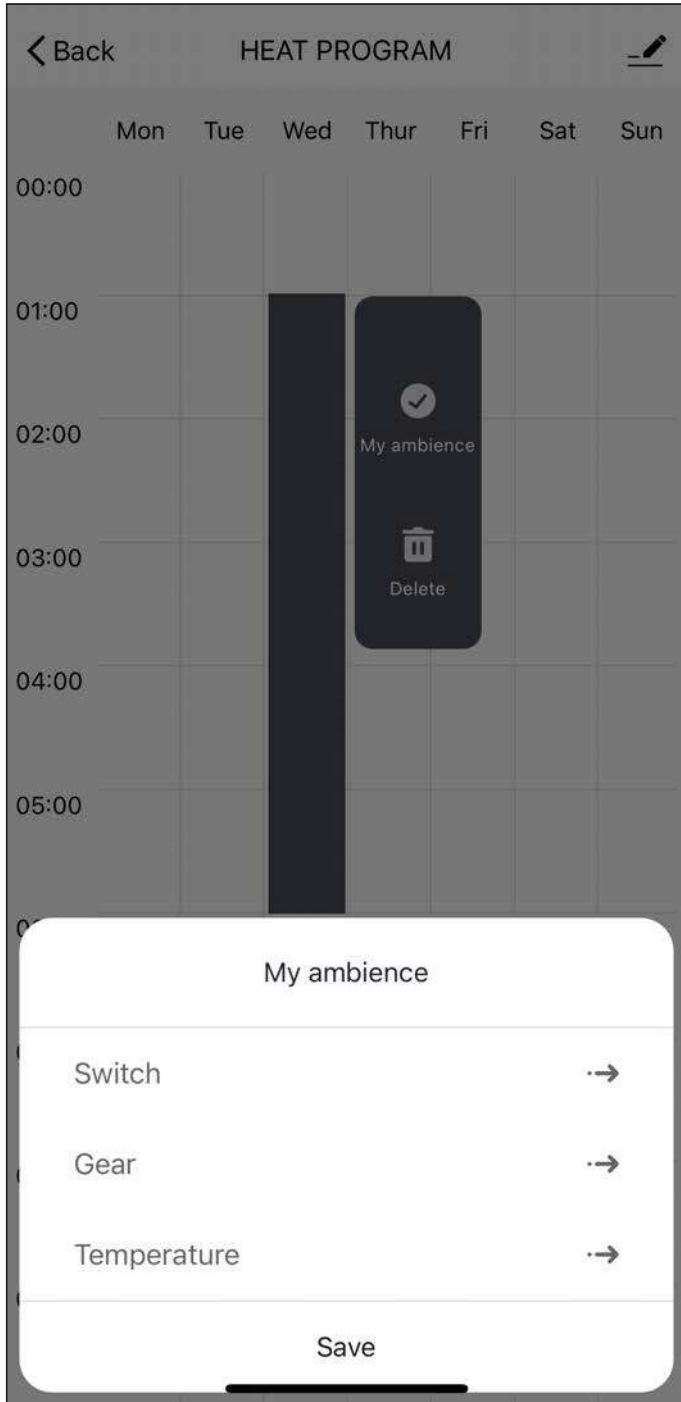


Figure 29: Heat Program - Step 3

3. The Heat Program is now set to turn the fireplace and heater on at 1:00PM every Wednesday to maintain a temperature of 20°C until 6:00PM.

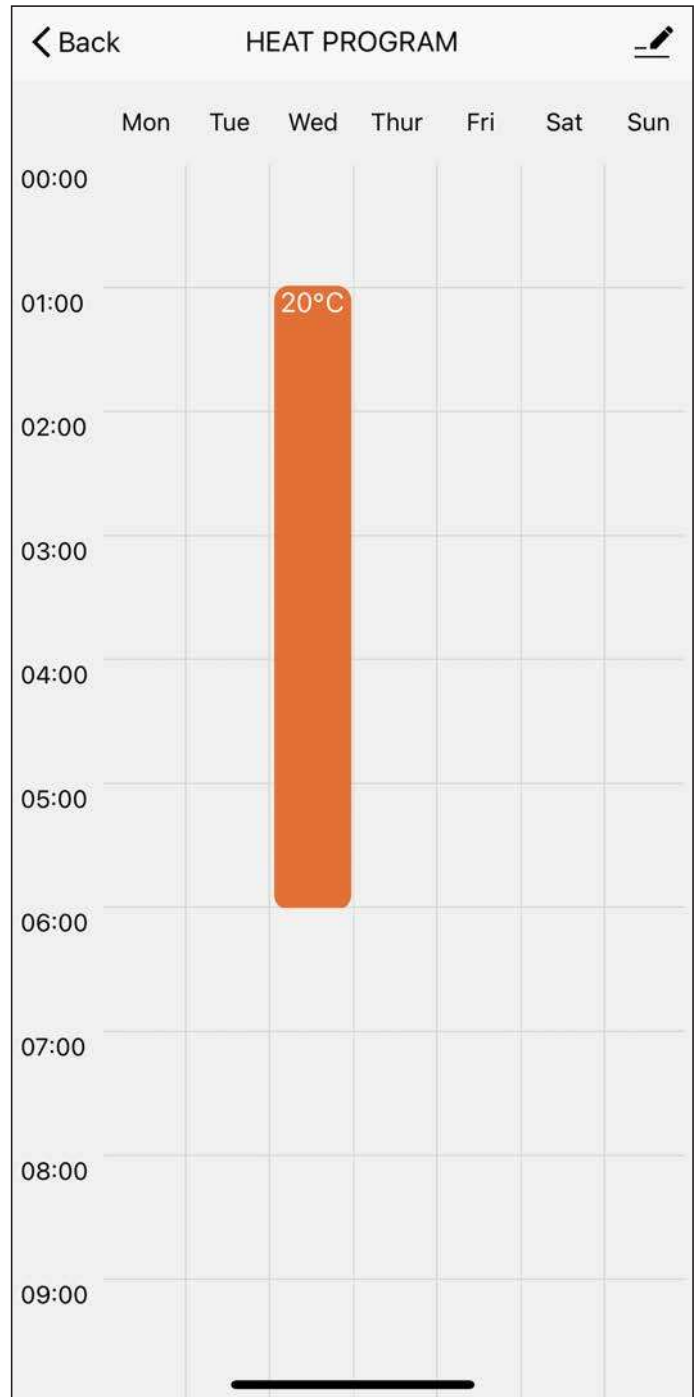


Figure 30: Heat Program - Step 4

REMOTE CONTROL BATTERY

To install or replace the remote control battery, follow the steps below:

1. Insert the supplied reset key or an unfolded paper clip into the pin hole in the back of remote control.
2. Push the key/paperclip into the pin hole to separate the remote top from the bottom housing.
3. Slide the existing battery down and out of the metal sleeve.
4. Slide the new battery (**CR2450**) up into the metal sleeve, **+ sign facing up**.
5. Re-attach the remote top to the bottom housing. It will automatically attach via magnets once close enough.

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE

On a semi-annual basis disconnect the fireplace from main power, wait for the heating element to cool and dust the fireplace with a dry cloth. Be careful not to brush any wires that may be exposed.

- To clean the glass of the fireplace simply use any household desired glass cleaner with paper towels.
- To clean the air inlets/outlets, wipe with a soft cloth or the nozzle of a vacuum cleaner
- Dust can easily build up around the heater area inside the fireplace, on the left and right sides. Take particular care to clean this area on a regular basis to prevent buildup.
- For long periods of inactivity, unplug the fireplace and ensure the surrounding area remains dry.

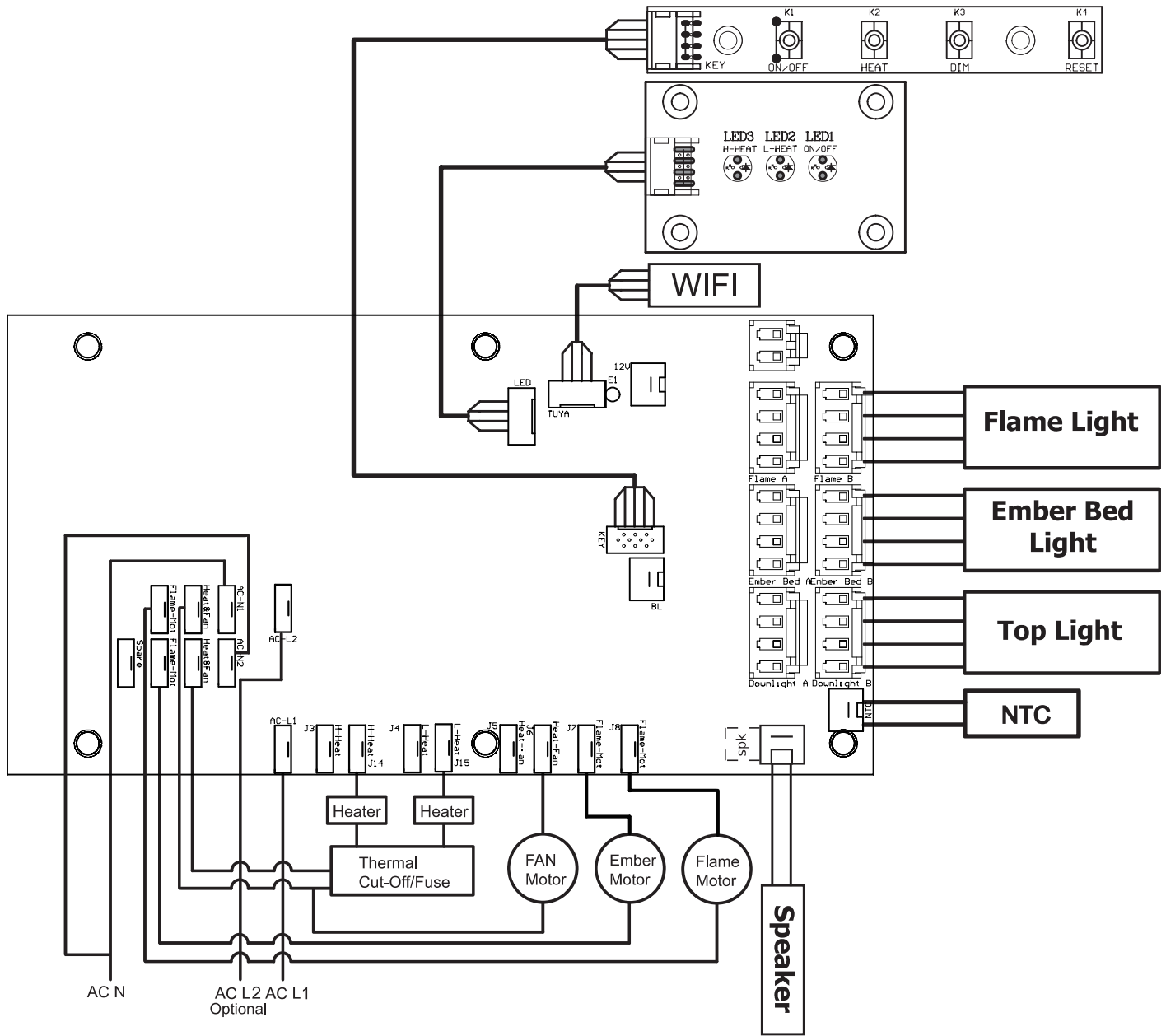


Figure 34: Wiring Diagram

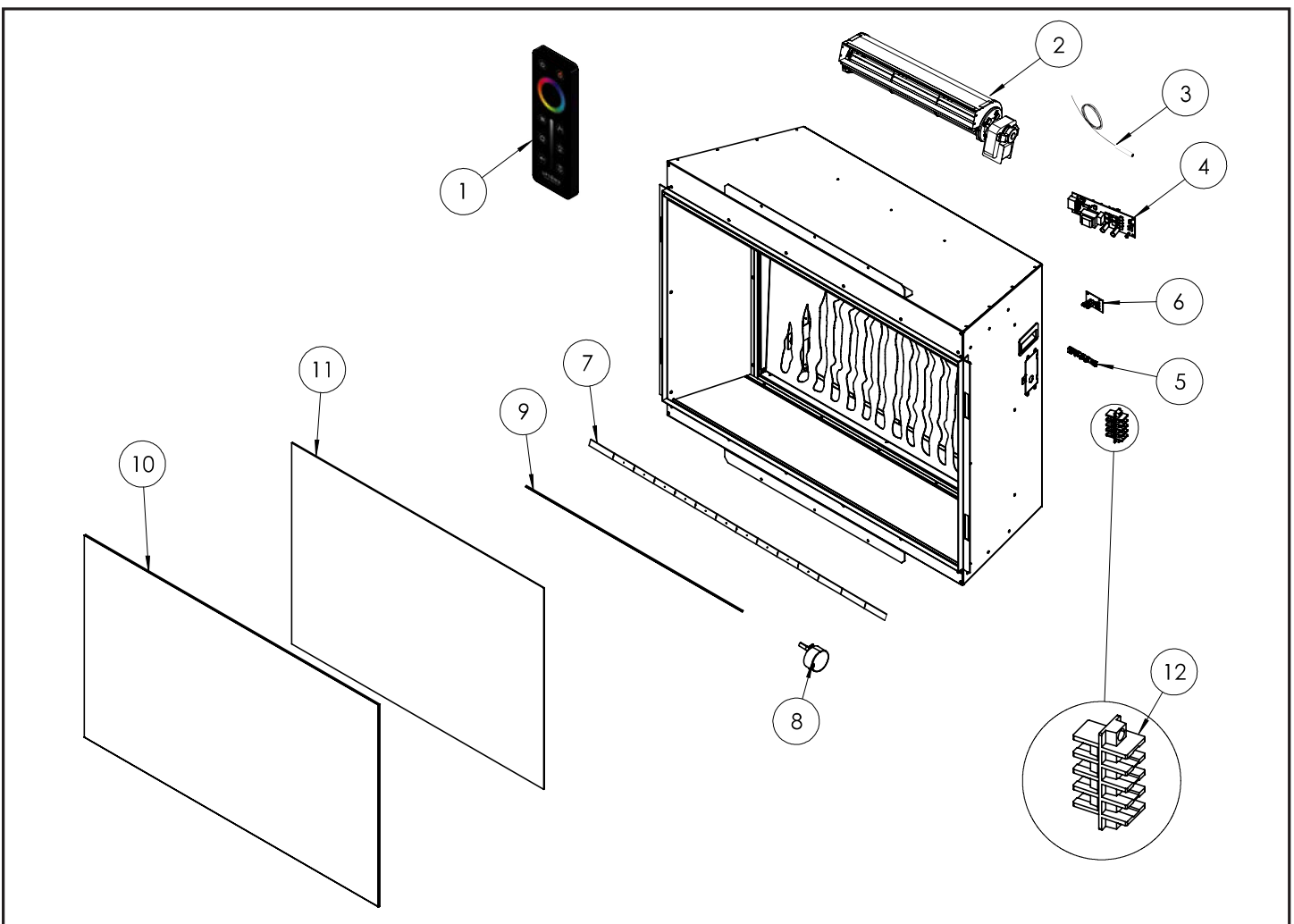


Figure 35: Parts Diagram
